




Coaching Dynasty

Jim O'Brien is the seventh former SJU player to serve as a head coach in the NBA, and begins his first year with the Indiana Pacers in 2007-08.


HAWKS IN THE DRAFT

Kim Foley (2003, Women's Basketball, '89)






