# HEAD COACH



## Gerry Quinlan Head Coach Notre Dame '91 - 13th Season

**Gerry Quinlan** is in his 13th season as head women's rowing coach at Saint Joseph's University and has developed the Hawks into one of the East's most competitive programs. Including his tenure at Saint Joseph's, Quinlan has amassed two decades of collegiate head coaching experience.

Quinlan's 2011 crew had one of the best seasons in school history, highlighted by two firsts for the program - a gold medal at the Aberdeen Dad Vail Regatta and the team title in the Atlantic 10 Championships. The Hawks' Second Varsity 8 captured the program's first Dad Vail gold medal and the Varsity 4 took home a silver, to help SJU finish second in the team standings. Saint Joseph's won the Freshman 8 at the conference meet, and earned top-three finishes in three other events to give the Hawks the league's team crown for the first time ever.

In 2010, the Hawks maintained their status as one of the top teams in the Atlantic 10 Conference, turned in medal-winning performances (one silver, two bronze) at the Aberdeen Dad Vail Regatta, and ended the year with a trip to the prestigious Henley Royal Regatta for the second time in school history. SJU's Varsity 8 also set a record in becoming the only team to advance to the Grand Final at the Dad Vail Regatta for six consecutive years.

The 2009 Hawks earned a number of firsts for the program. Saint Joseph's won its first-ever Atlantic 10 titles as the Varsity 8 and Quad boats earned the gold medals at the conference championships. Quinlan was recognized as the Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year for the first time in his career while the Hawks matched their best-ever team result with a third-place finish. The Hawks earned a bronze medal, which gave them the most medals of any team in the past four years. SJU's Freshman 8 also advanced to the Grand Final for the seventh consecutive season.

In 2008, Quinlan's charges placed a then best-ever third as a team at the Atlantic 10 Championship. The Varsity 8 boat earned its first-ever medal at A-10s, placing second, while also taking first at the Jesuit Invitational and the Kelly Cup. The rest of the Hawks also dominated at the city-wide Kelly Cup races, taking first place in every contest.

Quinlan guided the Hawks to victory in the Varsity 8 at the 2006 Dad Vail Regatta while that crew earned the school's first-ever trip to the Henley Royal Regatta in England. The Hawks rowed to a silver-medal finish in the Dad Vail Varsity 8 in 2007 while the Freshman 8 took silver in 2008.

During his tenure the Hawks have won three gold medals, six silvers, and four bronze medals at the Dad Vail Regatta. SJU has finished second in the women's point trophy standings twice and combined with the Hawks' men's team to win the Dad Vail Overall Points Trophy in 2005, 2006 and 2010.

Since his arrival at SJU in 1999, Quinlan has been one of the driving forces behind the growth of both the women's and men's rowing programs, nearly doubling participation during his tenure. Quinlan has been active in the development of the Robert M. Gillin, Jr. Boathouse, which opened in 2002, while maintaining alumni support and coordinating several local regattas, including the Jesuit Invitational Regatta.

Quinlan's résumé includes a six-year stint as the head coach of Northwestern University's men's and women's programs and a three-year stretch as the head women's coach at Notre Dame. His teams have won medals at the Dad Vail Regatta, the Champion International Collegiate Regatta and the Head of the Charles, and have competed in the Henley Royal Regatta and the Mexico City International Championships.

A 1991 graduate of the University of Notre Dame, Quinlan spent his prep career rowing at Monsignor Bonner High School in Drexel Hill, Pa. He and his wife Linda, a Hawks' assistant coach, reside in Philadelphia with their daughter, Maeve.

## ASSISTANT COACHES



### **Linda Quinlan Assistant Coach Loyola (Md.) '00 - 12th Season**

**Linda Quinlan** is in her 12th season as an assistant coach at Saint Joseph's and works primarily with the freshman squad.

Under her guidance, the Hawks' Freshman 8 has experienced great success, most recently with a gold-medal winning performance in the 2011 Atlantic 10 Championships. Over the years, the Freshman 8 has earned four silvers and two bronze medals at the Dad Vail Regatta, as well as gold medals at the ECAC Meet and the Jesuit Invitational.

Quinlan, a 2000 graduate of Loyola College, teaches math and science at the Philadelphia High School for Creative and Performing Arts, and is completing her master's of education at Saint Joseph's. She and husband Gerry, the Hawks' head coach, reside in Philadelphia with their daughter, Maeve.



### **Kelly O'Brien Assistant Coach Villanova '01 - 8th Season**

A former standout at Villanova University, **Kelly O'Brien** is in her eighth season as an assistant rowing coach at Saint Joseph's.

As a collegian, O'Brien competed in the Lightweight 8 and captured a National Championship in 1999 and a silver medal at the Henley Royal Regatta that same year.

A Philadelphia-area native, she coached at her high school alma mater, Archbishop Prendergast, in 2003. O'Brien is currently a Behavioral Therapist for the Lovaas Institute and is working towards her master's degree in special education at Saint Joseph's.



### **Brianna Kearns Assistant Coach Saint Joseph's '06 - 2nd Season**

Former Saint Joseph's standout **Brianna Kearns**, a 2006 graduate, is in her second season as assistant coach with the Hawks' staff.

Kearns was a member of the Varsity 8 for three years, including the boat which won the gold medal at the 2006 Dad Vail Regatta and made the Hawks' first-ever trip to the Henley Royal Regatta. In 2003, she rowed for the Freshman 8 that earned silver medals at both the Atlantic 10 Championships and the Dad Vail Regatta.

She most recently served as an assistant coach at Barry University for two seasons and prior to that, worked on the staff at Philadelphia University.

Kearns, a native of Northfield, N.J. who rowed for Mainland Regional High School, earned a master's of science degree from Barry University in 2010.



# GILLIN BOATHOUSE



The Robert M. Gillin, Jr. Boathouse was dedicated in June 2002 as the home of the Saint Joseph's University men's and women's rowing teams.

The 15,540 square foot state-of-the-art boathouse includes four heated boat bays with capacity for 42 eights, 14 fours/quads, and 14 small boats.

The boathouse sits on 20,381 square feet of land at the 1,000-meter mark of the famed Schuylkill River race course. The boathouse serves as SJU's home base for all of its home regattas, including the Dad Vail Regatta, Murphy Cup, and various dual races. The 750-square foot deck is a perfect viewing area for families, fans, and alumni.

The second floor of the boathouse includes locker rooms, showers, etc as well as a large common area for ergs, team meetings, and video review.

The Gillin Boat Club joined the Schuylkill Navy on September 20, 2004, by unanimous vote of the delegates of the Schuylkill Navy's 10 member clubs.

In addition to serving as the home of Hawk rowing, the Gillin Boathouse also hosts several summer camps including the Saint Joseph's University/Fairmount Park Commission's Community Rowing Program.

## Fairmount Park Community Rowing Program

In addition to serving as the home of Hawk rowing, the Gillin Boathouse also hosts the Fairmount Park Commission's Community Rowing Program. The first step in a long-term partnership between the University and the Fairmount Park Commission, the program is designed to provide an experience for youth in the city of Philadelphia who have not had the opportunity to experience the sport of rowing.



DIRECTIONS TO GILLIN BOATHOUSE (2200 Kelly Drive, Philadelphia)

**From the East:** Follow I-76 West to Exit 340 (Lincoln Drive/Kelly Drive) on the right. Take Exit 340 and get into the left lane, following signs for Kelly Drive. Move to right lane and merge right at the bottom of the Exit ramp. Take Kelly Drive past four traffic lights. Turn right into the first parking lot on the right. The boathouse is located at the end of the parking lot.

**From the Northeast or South:** Follow I-95 to I-76 West to Exit 340 (Lincoln Drive/Kelly Drive) on the right. Take Exit 340 and get into the left lane, following signs for Kelly Drive. Move to right lane and merge right at the bottom of the Exit ramp. Take Kelly Drive past four traffic lights. Turn right into the first parking lot on the right. The boathouse is located at the end of the parking lot.

**From the West:** Follow I-76 East to Exit 340 (Lincoln Drive/Kelly Drive) on the left. Take Exit 340 and get into the left lane, following signs for Kelly Drive. Move to right lane and merge right at the bottom of the Exit ramp. Take Kelly Drive past four traffic lights. Turn right into the first parking lot on the right. The boathouse is located at the end of the parking lot.

# 2010-11 YEAR IN REVIEW

The Saint Joseph's women's rowing team had another banner year in 2011, highlighted by two firsts - the Hawks' first Atlantic 10 team title and the first-ever gold medal in Second Varsity 8 at the Dad Vail Regatta.

The Hawks boated an experienced squad with strong senior leadership and began the season with first-place finishes in the Jesuit Invitational (Varsity 8, Varsity 4) and the Murphy Cup (Second Varsity 8, Freshman 8).

SJU continued to build speed through the season as it geared up for the conference championships and ultimately the Dad Vails.

The Hawks and their A-10 foes battled strong currents and windy conditions on the Cooper River for the Atlantic 10 Championships, which caused the cancellation of three races (Novice 4, Lightweight 4, Quad). SJU was one of the favorites in the Varsity 8 but finished second to Dayton in the feature race, while it captured the Freshman 8 for the second time in school history. The gold-medal winning novice boat was comprised of Paige Cesky, Kelsey Larzelere, Victoria Stewart, Alexa Lawson, Kelly Rupert, Molly Lawrence, Stacey Terlik, Laura Buongiorno, and Laken Ethun. Saint Joseph's also earned bronze medals in the Second Varsity 8 and Varsity 4, to total 49 points and tie Rhode Island and UMass, but the Hawks' Varsity 8 finish gave them the tiebreaker and their first-ever conference crown.

Saint Joseph's followed the A-10 title with a successful day at the Kelly Cup, which represents the city championship. The Hawks swept the Eights, taking first-place finishes in the Varsity 8, Second Varsity 8 and Freshman 8, while taking second place in the Varsity 4.

The Hawks entered competition in the Aberdeen Dad Vail Regatta with high expectations and didn't disappoint. SJU finished second in the team standings to Purdue and was the only team to be represented in the finals of the three main events. The Second Varsity 8 led the way, capturing the program's first gold medal in that event with a crew comprised of Katie Messina, Jenni Broring, Brittany Roth, Ariana McDevitt, Victoria Angelucci, Meaghan Scher, Jackie Castorino, Alex Karls and Rachel Shustack. The Varsity 4 advanced to the Grand Final for the first time since 1998, and in a difficult event to medal in, captured the silver. The Varsity 8 won both its heat and semifinal but faced strong crews in the finals and finished fourth.

The Hawks' seniors concluded a strong run as SJU was the only team to advance to the Grand Final every year for the past four years and the only team to medal three times in the past four years.

Danielle Brady, Brianne Kammerman and Colleen Smith earned Atlantic 10 All-Conference First Team honors while Clare Burns was chosen to the Second Team. Brady also excelled in the classroom and was chosen to the A-10 All-Academic Team while becoming the second consecutive women's rower, and third in the past four years, to receive SJU's Class of 1950 award given to the top graduating student-athlete. She was also named the *Philadelphia Inquirer* Academic All-Area Performer of the Year, becoming the second Hawk to earn this honor in the past three seasons. Angela Acuña and Alex Karls joined Brady on the Academic All-Area Team.

# JESUIT INVITATIONAL



Saint Joseph's Rowing established the Jesuit Invitational in 1999 and it has become a major race in the collegiate rowing season, featuring solely Jesuit colleges. The Jesuit Invitational is held every year in March on the Cooper River in Pennsauken, N.J.

The Casey Ferrone Memorial Trophy is awarded to the Men's Varsity 8 champion, while the Robert Gillin, Jr., Memorial Trophy is awarded to the Women's Varsity 8 winner.

The Cannonball Trophy is given to the overall team champion. It is named in honor of Saint Ignatius Loyola, the founder of the Society of Jesus, who had his leg shattered by a cannonball while defending Spain from an attack by France. The Cannonball Trophy serves as a reminder that all good things start with pain. The glory of winning is only possible by withstanding the mental and physical pain of the 2000-meter race course. The trophy is awarded to the school with the highest combined points in the day's races. It is a traveling trophy which the winner returns every year. The winning team receives a small cannonball that is theirs to keep as a reminder of their championship performance.

# A PROUD TRADITION



The Saint Joseph's rowing programs have a proud history of success on the water, but a number of alums have achieved a great amount of post-graduate success in the sport as well. **Mike Teti '78, Teresa Zarzeczny Bell '88 and Renee Hykel '01** are three SJU legends that have gone on to even greater successes since their days on Hawk Hill. All three have taken their rowing careers to the highest levels of international competition, making the SJU rowing program a cradle of champions.

Arguably the best-known oarsman in America, Mike Teti was a top Hawk rower, graduating from SJU with a sociology degree in 1978.

"Saint Joseph's gave me the opportunity to compete and also the opportunity for a great education," Teti says. "I owe SJU a great debt for all of the opportunities I received."

From 1977-93, Teti rowed on 11 national teams, including three trips to the Olympic Games. He won 24 national championships, a gold medal in the men's eight at the 1987 World Championships and a bronze medal in the same event at the 1988 Olympics. He was named the 1987 United States Rowing Male Athlete of the Year.

Teti achieved even greater notoriety as a coach, guiding the U.S. men's open eight squad to an unprecedented three straight world championships. He also coached the men's four with coxswain to world championship gold. In 1996 he led the lightweight men's four to an Olympic bronze medal before being named USRowing's Head Men's Sweep Coach, the highest coaching honor in the country, in October of that year.

Teti became the U.S. Olympic coach following the 2000 Games, and led the men's eight boat to gold in Athens in 2004, a feat that the United States had not achieved since 1964 when another coach with Hawk ties, Al Rosenberg, led the Americans to victory. He also guided the U.S. Men to the bronze medal at the 2008 Olympics in Beijing.

Teti is currently the head coach of the men's crew team at the University of California and was inducted into the National Rowing Federation's Hall of Fame in 2010.

Teresa Bell is no stranger to success on the international level, either. Her Olympic dream began in the fall of 1992 when the International Olympic Committee announced that her event, the lightweight double sculls, would be a part of the Olympic Games in 1996.

In truth, Bell's journey really began back in 1985. In that year the sophomore joined the Saint Joseph's women's rowing club team. By 1988, she was a part-time member of the varsity squad, and her Hawk Hill career culminated in victory in the women's singles event at the prestigious Dad Vail Regatta. Bell later went on to be a member of both the Crescent Boat Club and the Fairmount Rowing Club, for whom she still rows when she is in Philadelphia.

In 1996, Bell was preparing for Olympic competition with intense workouts three times a day. She put in most of her work in Tennessee, the home

of the United States Women's Rowing Center. She also spent time training in Georgia in preparation for the Olympic Trials. Before the Olympic Games, she spent a month rowing in Europe before returning home for the Atlanta games.

This exhausting routine helped prepare Bell for the rigors of the highest level of international competition, but all of the work paid off in the end as Bell and her partner, Lindsay Burns, took the silver medal in the lightweight double sculls.

From Hawk Hill to the Olympic medal stand, Bell never forgot her roots. "I enjoyed my experience at Saint Joseph's," Bell says. "It made me who I am today. Besides rowing, Saint Joseph's taught me to be open-minded and that has really helped me."

Following the Olympics, Bell placed fifth in the same event at the 1997 World Championships. She was inducted, along with Teti, as a member of the inaugural class on the Saint Joseph's Athletics Hall of Fame in 1999.

SJU's influence is still being felt in the rowing community as Class of one of the top names in the sport. She is a five-time member of the U.S. National Team and competed at the World Championships every year from 2003 to 2006. In 2005, the former Saint Joseph's walk-on took silver in the lightweight double sculls at the World Championships in Gifu, Japan. In 2007, Hykel was the U.S. National Champion in the lightweight single sculls.

The year 2008 marked Hykel's first trip to the Olympic Games as she traveled to Beijing to compete in the lightweight double sculls event, the same event Teresa Bell took silver in at the 1996 Games. Hykel and her partner, former SJU assistant rowing coach Jen Goldsack, just missed the medal final after reaching the A/B semifinal.

Teti, Bell and Hykel are just three of more than a dozen Hawks to compete internationally, as athletes such as Sean Drea and the Flanigan brothers, Donald and Richard, have done Saint Joseph's proud at the highest levels of the sport.

In addition to these individuals, the Saint Joseph's rowing program continues to write new chapters in its ever-expanding legacy. Since 1999, the Hawk men's and women's teams have combined to finish first or second in the race for the coveted Jack Bratton Trophy, awarded to the Dad Vail Regatta's overall points champion, four times, most recently in 2010.

The women's program, meanwhile, has developed into one of the region's most formidable.

The 2006 season was a banner one for the Hawk program as a whole, as SJU turned in its then-best-ever finishes at the San Diego Crew Classic and Atlantic 10 Championships, and winning gold in the Varsity 8 at the Dad Vail Regatta. The 2006 team also competed in the prestigious Henley Royal Regatta in the United Kingdom, a first for Saint Joseph's.

In 2009, the Hawks' Varsity 8 set a record in becoming the only team to advance to the Grand Final of the Dad Vail Regatta for five consecutive years and increased that mark to six straight in 2010. SJU's Freshman 8 also advanced to the Grand Final for eight years in a row. The 2010 season culminated with Saint Joseph's competing at Henley for the second time in school history, while in 2011, the Hawks won their first Atlantic 10 Conference team championship.

## THE HAWK



The Saint Joseph's Hawk mascot has been flapping its wings for more than a half a century. One of the most famous mascots in college sports, the Hawk is best known for staying in constant motion by flapping its wings throughout every basketball game and representing the Saint Joseph's motto, "The Hawk Will Never Die".

Saint Joseph's athletic teams have been recognized with the nickname "Hawks" since 1929. At that time, the school's yearbook editor initiated a contest among the student body for a symbol. More than 100 submissions were narrowed, with "Hawks" winning out over "Grenadiers" by a slim margin. The name was appropriate because it typified "the fighting spirit of our crimson and gray athletes and it is suggestive of the aerial attack which has made our football team famous." Football, ironically, was discontinued at SJU following the 1939 season.

The Hawk mascot has garnered numerous accolades in its 55-year history. It has been selected as the nation's top mascot by *The Sporting News*, *Sports Illustrated*, *Sports Illustrated for Kids*, *Street & Smith's Basketball Yearbook* and *ESPN College Basketball* magazine and was a nominee for the 2008 Mascot Hall of Fame.



# THE UNIVERSITY



Founded in 1851, Saint Joseph's is an independent, Catholic, Jesuit university teaching disciplined reasoning, effective communication and a love of learning. The friendly atmosphere and close-knit campus ensure that students don't get lost in either the literal or the figurative sense at Saint Joseph's. Expanded library, computer and athletic facilities add a big-time "feel" to this growing university.

## SUCCESSFUL STUDENTS

Men and women leave Saint Joseph's prepared. The University boasts an excellent record of placing its graduates in first-time

jobs, professional schools and other advanced degree programs. Part-time work and internships provide real-world experiences, the kind which delight future employers. And with its many diverse student organizations, SJU offers ample opportunities to assume leadership positions.

An extensive on-campus recruitment program provides graduates with a head start in their employment search. Regular meetings with faculty advisors, along with advisory programs in the health professions and in pre-law, assist students who wish to further their schooling.

## PHILADELPHIA

SJU's Philadelphia location gives students access to two worlds. The campus resembles a park, surrounded by the stately homes of Philadelphia's historic Main Line suburbs. Yet students have access to the cultural, commercial and recreational activities of downtown Philadelphia — only a short ride away. SJU students take frequent advantage of the artistic and cultural resources Philadelphia offers, as well. They visit the Philadelphia Museum of Art; the Pennsylvania Academy of the Fine Arts; the Franklin Institute Science Museum; the Academy of Music, which houses ballet and opera; and the new Kimmel Center, home to the Philadelphia Orchestra. In addition, SJU students enjoy rooting for Philadelphia's teams in the four major professional sports leagues.
